Veer away from the lie.

(Verses 13-15)

1. The lie is that we can find fulfilling life somewhere other than Jesus. What are you doing these days to veer away from that lie?
2. Wayne Grudem says, "Sin is ultimately irrational." What does that mean to you?
3. The solution is faith. Read Hebrews 11:6 and then discuss: How are you experiencing the reward these days as you seek God?

Adamantly pursue Jesus.

(Verses 16-21)

1. Verse 21 says: "Yes, a person is a fool to store up earthly wealth but not have a rich relationship with God." What does that mean to you personally these days to devote yourself to a rich relationship with God?
2. Which of the following truths stands out to you most these days? Explain.
 - A. Wealth belongs to God and we are stewards.
 - B. Wealth is temporary.
 - C. Wealth is given to us for a purpose: to invest in His Kingdom.
 - D. Wealth is not the key to life; a relationship with Jesus is!

Leave your worries behind.

(Verses 22-29)

1. What do you tend to worry about these days? Why?
2. What do verses 23-29 say to you about these worries?

Unite with His purposes.

(Verses 30-31)

1. Read again verse 31. What does it mean for you personally these days to live this out?
2. Below are three ways we can unite with Him in His purposes. Which of these stands out to you most these days. Explain.
 - A. Unite with Him in being all about His own glory.
 - B. Be convinced that His glory is what satisfies the human soul.
 - C. Give your life to making His glory known.

Exalt Jesus.

(Verses 32-34)

1. What does it mean for you these days to treasure Jesus above all else?
2. How are you doing that? How would you like to do so more in the coming weeks and months?
